

*Biblical Drama based on Genesis 1 and 2**Narrators 1-3, God, Light, Sky, Land, Sea, Plants, Sun, Fish & Birds, Animals, Man*

Narrator 1: For years and years, people have asked the same question: Who made the world? The Book of Genesis has the answer: God did!

Narrator 2: In the beginning of time, everything was dark. The earth had no form, no shape. But God was there.

God: Let there be light!

Light: Here I am! Wow — look at all the colors! Awesome!

God: Yes, your light really adds a lot. I'm going to call you "day." That dark, shady spot over there will be "night." But wait — there's more. Let there be sky!

Sky: Ta-da! Oh, I love this blue tint you've given me. And what's that cute little fluffy thing? Come here, fluffy thing!

God: That's a cloud. Just don't touch it when there's lightning coming from it, though. It might give you a little shock. Now, let there be dry land and sea!

Land: Land, here, at your service. Hey — the sea keeps coming on my territory. No fair!

Sea: Oh, lighten up, land. Haven't you ever heard of waves?

God: Waves! Hmmm. That gives me an idea. I wonder what waves of grain might look like? Let there be grain ... and fruit ... and vegetables!

Plants: My, my, aren't we a colorful bunch? But let's be honest — those rutabagas could use some work, don't you think?

God: No, I like them just as they are. And to keep ALL of you growing strong, you'll need warmth. Let there be sun! And while we're at it, let there be a moon and stars, too.

Sun: (*singing*) I am your sunshine! Your only sunshine! La, la, la, la, la ...

God: Nice tune. Hey, good idea! Let there be birds of the air that sing and make music! And let there be fish that swim in the sea!

Fish & Birds: (*singing*) Birds gotta fly and fish gotta swim

Land: Hey, what about me? Don't I get any animals?

God: Let the earth bring forth creatures of every kind: dogs that bark, cows that moo, and turtles that ... are turtle-y!

Animals: Bark! Moo! Um ... "turtle-y"?!

God: Ah, now all we need is someone to take care of this beautiful world I've made. Let there be a man and a woman!

Man: Hi there. I'm Adam. And this lovely lady is Eve.

God: Bless you both! Be fruitful, multiply, and fill the earth. Help yourselves to the food, but don't take too much. And watch over this wonderful world, okay? I do love it so.

Whew! Have seven days passed already? It's time for a rest!

Narrator 3: God saw that everything he made was very good. At last, his work was finished, and the world was complete. And God blessed the seventh day and made it a holy day of rest.

Drama Idea: Use a flashlight as part of this skit. Invite "God" to hold it. Whenever God creates something new, he can shine it on that character. Encourage characters to use actions to make their characters come to life. For example, the "plants" can be waving in the wind as they speak, or curled up on the floor like fruit, etc.
