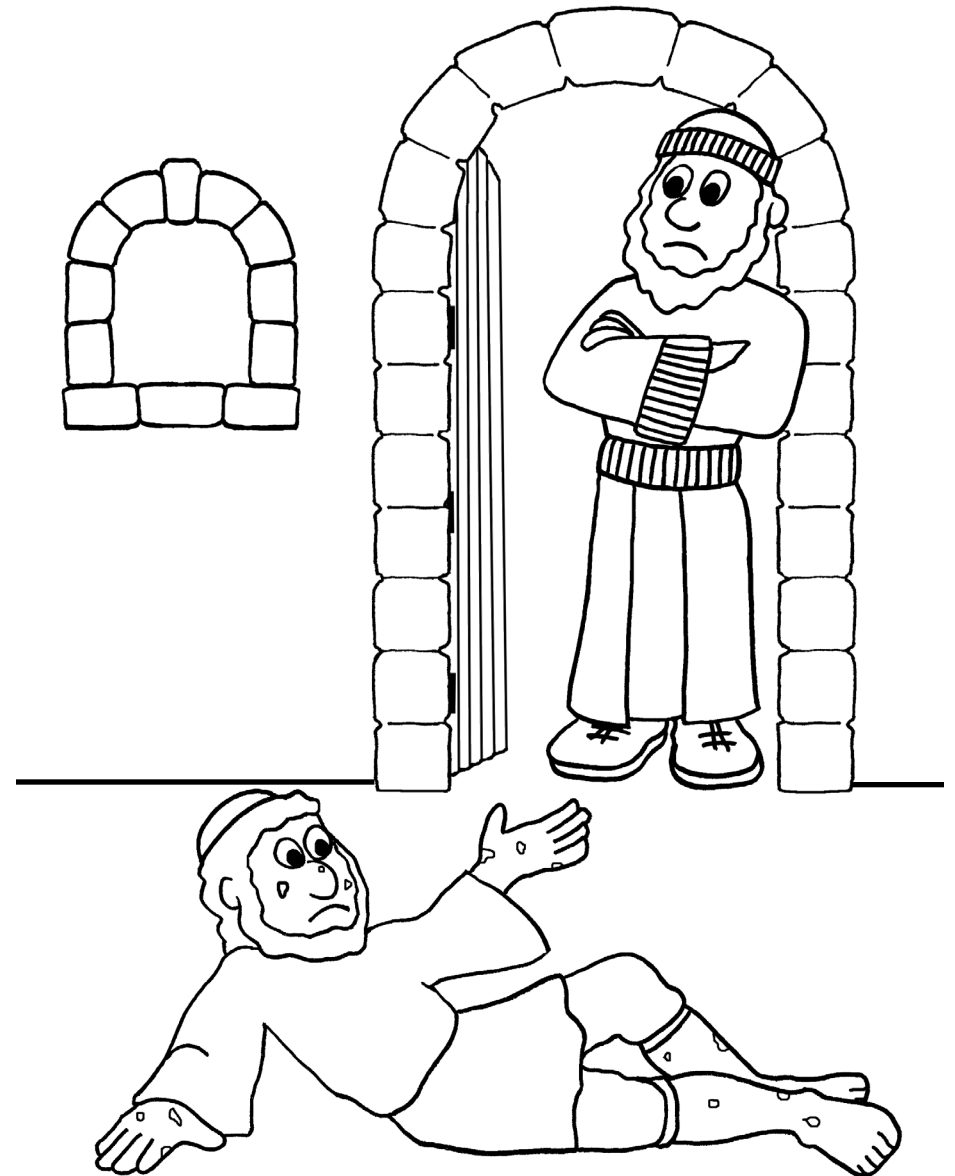

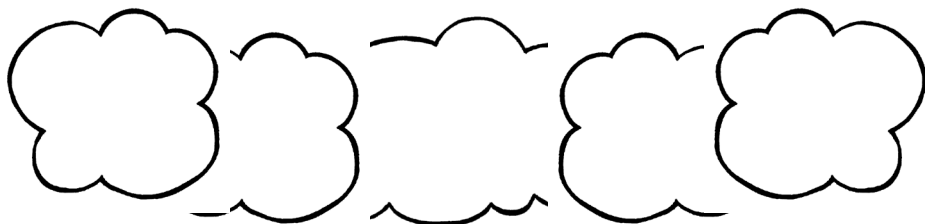


A very poor man laid by a rich man's home.
