THIS WEEK’S SCRIPTURE TEXTS

First Lesson: Deuteronomy 8:1-10

Remember the Wilderness

The Word of the Lord came to the people Israel, reminding them to remember the time they spent in the wilderness on their way to the Promised Land. The trials and testing of the people were used by God to help them examine their allegiances and to learn to trust in the One who was steadfast in his love for them.

Psalm 100

He Made Us; We Are His

Make a joyful noise, sang the psalmist, and serve him with a glad heart. The Lord is our God and he made us — we are the sheep of his pasture.

Second Lesson: Philippians 4:6-20

Whatever is Commendable

As Paul ended his letter to the Christians in Philippi, he urged them to focus on all things positive and uplifting, including anything good they might have learned from his witness to them. His friends in Philippi had been generous to him and he thanked them for their gift.

Gospel Lesson: Luke 17:11-19

One Leper Praises God

Luke recounts a story from Jesus’ life in which he healed ten lepers of their dreaded disease. Only one of the ten returned to give thanks to Jesus for his mercy. That one, a Samaritan, dropped to his knees at Christ’s feet and thanked him profusely. Jesus remarked in that moment, “Were there not ten who were healed?”

Suggestions for the Sunday:

- * The liturgical color is green.
- * The Kyrie OR the Hymn of Praise may be used during Ordinary Time.
- * Use the Apostles’ Creed.
- * Consider a mission project in which the entire congregation can get involved during the week of Thanksgiving as a sign of gratefulness for God’s bounty. It could be a meal cooked and delivered, a random act of kindness in the community, or simply inviting someone with no family to eat with your family.
- * Consider posting a large piece of paper on a wall in the sanctuary and asking people to draw on it or write some words about what they are thankful for. Leave it up for a few weeks.
