Message There are all kinds of things about God that we don’t understand. Here are a few. [Share a few of these and then ask the kids if they can think of any.] • How can God create something just by speaking? “Let there be mountains.” It’s not working for me. • How can Jesus die and then wake up from being dead? Nobody else can do that. • How can the Holy Spirit help us have faith when we can’t see him or feel him? • How can God be everywhere, at the same time, and know everything about everyone in the world? He knows what we do, what we think, how we feel, and every tiny thing about our bodies. • How can God make all the people in the world different from each other? Every single person is different from the rest. Even twins may look alike, but their bodies are different, they have their own personalities, likes and dislikes, etc. How does he do that? I’ve got one more for you. Today is Trinity Sunday because God is triune. That means three-in-one. We say he is one God who has three persons. How does that work? Some say it’s like an apple, because it has three parts: the skin or peel, the inside fruit, and the seeds. Hmmm... but those are three separate parts. If we cut an apple, we can see all three separately. It’s hard to imagine, but God the Father, God the Son, and God the Spirit are always three-in-one. They’re always together as one, and always separate as three. We can’t understand it, just like we can’t understand how God created everything, Jesus woke up from being dead, and the Spirit gives us faith and helps it grow. Does that mean it’s not true? NO!! There are many, many things we don’t know about God, but what we do know is that everything he says is true. We believe it because everything he has promised has come true, and because we trust him and the Bible. So, what do we think about God being three-in-one? We think it’s a MYSTERY. It’s just one of the mysteries of God that we can’t understand, but one day, when we’re in heaven, we will. Until then, what can we do? TRUST. We trust our ALMIGHTY GOD. Let’s pray.
